5. The student who's going to Penn State is either the student who will major in Mathematics or the student who received the \$40,000 scholarship.
6. The student who's going to Brown won't major in Astronomy.
7. Yvonne was awarded some amount less than the student who will major in Theology.
8. The person who received the \$25,000 scholarship won't major in Mathematics.
9. Of Nettie and the person who's going to Stanford, one will major in Theology and the other received the \$40,000 scholarship.
10. Of Gwendolyn and the student who will major in Theology, one will be going to Cornell next year and the other received the \$25,000 scholarship.
11. Of the student who will major in Physics and Lauren, one will be going to Stanford next year and the other received the \$35,000 scholarship.
